How to find a masters thesis in the library catalog:



You can find theses by searching the library catalog, Koha: https://wilson.bywatersolutions.com/


If you know the title or author for the thesis you are looking for, you can simply type it in the search box.

If you would like to see all of the master's theses, type "theses" into the search box. This will give you a list of all the theses we have currently processed and made available to view.

As you scroll through the list, you will see a small link that says "Available in PDF format."


